	IF yes, say: Thank you. [Go to Questionnaire]
,	IF student is under 18 years of age, say: Are you (student's name) parent or guardian?
	IF yes, say:  Hi, I am calling on behalf of ( school/district). We are interested in learning what former students are doing since they left school. I'd like to ask you or (student's name) a few questions that will help us make our school programs better. This should only take about 10 minutes, and neither your name nor the student's will be used. You can choose not to answer any question and stop at any time. Would you or (student's name) be willing to answer a few questions?
	IF yes, say: Thank you. [Go to Questionnaire]
•	IF not the parent or guardian, say:  When would be a good time to reach either (student's name) or (the parent/guardian)? Thank you, I will try back then. (Write information in notes section on call log page and try again at that date and time.) The interview can be conducted with a person familiar with the work and school activities of the former student.
•	<ul> <li>IF the student or parent/guardian seems hesitant, try these words of encouragement:</li> <li>This will only take a few minutes.</li> <li>All your responses will be kept confidential – we will not use your name at all.</li> <li>Your experience is very valuable to us and would be very helpful.</li> <li>Could I call back at a more convenient time?</li> </ul>
,	<i>IF the student or parent/guardian <u>refuses or seems unwilling</u> to answer the questions say:</i>
	Okay. Thank you for your time. Goodbye.
