

Accessing the ODE Post-School Outcomes (PSO) Application 2.0 for the Follow-Up

WHAT is the PSO Collection?

The federal law that governs how public and state institutions provide special education and related services to youth with disabilities is under IDEA. In order to comply with IDEA, states **must report annually** to the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP). One of the indicators being reported is B-14, or Post-School Outcomes.

B-14 is the measurement of any post-school engagement outcomes for youth with disabilities.

It is defined, within IDEA, as the percentage of youth who:

- are no longer in secondary school,
- had IEPs in effect at the time they left school, and
- within one year of leaving high school, met reporting requirements for one of the post-school engagement outcomes.

WHEN can you access the PSO Application 2.0?

Follow-Up collection List Review: around April 15 of each year, the PSO App will open for a District List Review – view your student list for accuracy – add or delete students as necessary through the ODE Data Team per SSID number and a request for edit needed: ode.oss-datateam@ode.oregon.gov

No input can be done until the Application opens for input at the first Thursday of June and ends on the last Monday in September each year.
